## Robert Burns(1759-1796)

Rabbie Burns is proclaimed the national poet of Scotland. Since the publication of his songs and poems they have never been out of fashion and in days gone by his book of poems was often found on the shelf beside the bible. His birthday January 25th is the annual occasion of "Burns Night" festivities.

Burns revealed his views on religious matters mainly in his series of satirical poems consisting of "Holy Willie's Prayer", "The Holy Fair", "The Ordination", "Address to the Unco Guid" and "The Kirk's Alarm".  
Looking at "**Holy Willie's Prayer**"

*O Thou that in the Heavens does dwell,  
Wha, as it pleases best Thyself,  
Sends ane to Heaven, an ten to Hell,  
A' for Thy glory,  
And no for onie guid or ill  
They've done before Thee!*

It was written about an Elder (William Fisher) in the parish of Mauchline at whose instigation the Kirk Session took action against Gavin Hamilton for his failure to celebrate the Sabbath in said proper manner. Fisher was a hypocrite and himself a sinner, Burns described Fisher as "*a rather oldish bachelor, much and justly famed for that polemical chattering which ends in tipping orthodoxy, and for that spiritualised bawdry which refines to liquorish devotion*".

The poems were not anti religion, it was a condemnation of the religious hypocrisy and self righteousness evident in those days.

Global warning seemed to give Ballantrae a miss during 2008 as the mean temperature of 9.45degC was the lowest since I started, in August 2001, to measure temperatures properly, that is using thermometers of known accuracy and housed in a Stevenson screen. This figure is derived from adding up both the 366 maximum and the minimum daily temperatures recorded during the year and dividing by 732. The “end” figure does not vary too much — the highest was for 2007 at 9.99degC, so not much should be deduced from figures for just one year.

I have now acculated 12years of daily rainfall readings (that's4383!), and while the 2008 total of 1752.7mm (69ins) was above the 12year average of 1512.6mm (59.55ins), it was not as high as 2000 and 2002.

New Year's day 2009 was sunny and calm but with a hard frost at first. The more seasonable gales and rain returned on the 15th and even more so on the 17th with some vivid thunder and lightning as a finale.

It is now 150years since the SS Royal Charter foundered in a storm off the north coast of Anglesay. As a result of an inquiry into the disaster, the first official gale warnings were inaugurated, making use of the new electric telegraph as a means of communication. It was in the time of office of the first director of the Met. Office (then called “the Meteorological Department of the Board of Trade”), namely Robert Fitzroy — the same Admiral who sailed to South America with Darwin on HMS Beagle.
